The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, is our Five Talents' patron. He has served as the Archbishop of Canterbury since 2013. Throughout his time serving as the Archbishop he has spoken out for communities which have been marginalised, advocating for better care and support for communities across the globe who are affected by malnutrition, conflict, poverty and lack of education.



Dr Althea-Maria Rivas is a Senior Lecturer on Global Development and Peace and Conflict at SOAS University of London. Prior to joining SOAS, Dr Rivas worked in humanitarian assistance, gender and development and governance within various INGOs. Her research focuses on intersectionality, and the racialised and gendered nature of aid, post-conflict reconstruction and social justice.



Lord Jonathan Oates is the Chief Executive of United Against Malnutrition & Hunger and has been a member of House of Lords since 2015. During the Coalition Government (2010-2015), he was Deputy Director of Communications in 10 Downing Street and Chief of Staff to the Deputy Prime Minister. From 2017-2019 he was Senior Adviser to the Children's Investment Fund Foundation, a charitable foundation working principally in Africa and South Asia. He has a particular interest in international development and climate change.



Irene Nyambura, is the Programme Advisor to the Five Talents partnership programme in Aru, The Democratic Republic of Congo. Irene has first hand knowledge and experience working directly with communities who are faced with difficult challenges and intercommunal conflict. While Aru is peaceful there are sometimes flare ups of civil unrest or insecurity.
